Lori Lee Triplett, aka Maude Bannister, the Fabric Detective, will be on “The Case of the Chintz Columns and Calico Cloth”. She’ll ask council members to work with her to examine the history of chintz using 19th century antique fabric and quilts.

Lori, business manager for Quilt and Textile Collections, combines her passions for research, writing and performing—think stage, screen and radio—when she speaks to quilt guilds across the country. Quilt and Textile Collections manages the Poos Collection, one of the largest privately held quilt and textile collections in the world. She is author of more than 15 books, including *Indigo Quilts* (C&T Publishing, 2015) and *Pioneer Quilts* (C&T

Publishing/Kansas City Star Quilts, 2017). An art quilter, Lori likes to work with hand-dyed and hand-painted fabrics. Her art has been exhibited; featured in publications and on websites; and is found in private, corporate and museum collections. She is currently creating quilts for two solo exhibitions: “Tree of Life” and “Indigo Images.”

Lori’s workshop Sunday, March 24, is Delft Medallion Star, a lovely blue-and-white quilt that features her “Two Birds in a Bush” painting on fabric in the center. Creating the quilt combines dimensional appliqué and paper piecing with an invisible stitch. For information, see page 4 of this newsletter. For registration, see page 5. Dear Quilting Friends,

### A Few Quilt Tips From Linda Pumphrey

1. Read directions first, cut later. To help avoid mistakes down the line, always read the complete cutting instructions before you begin.
2. Make the most of your yardage. Cut out the larger shapes before turning to the smaller ones. Careful cutting can help keep rotary cutter tips sharp.
3. Use tools wisely. When rotary cutting, start with the blade about ½" up on the ruler, then cut it back to the tip and then cut forward. "If you always start cutting at the tip, the tip of your ruler will get

chipped away from the blade over time and no longer be square."

4. Be precise. To ensure points and seams match perfectly, you must cut correctly, sew accurately, and press precisely. Make sure to press each seam before moving onto the next step.
6. Prevent shadows. Press the fabric seam toward the darker fabric or press seams open.
7. Trim loose threads. Darker threads will shadow through the lighter fabric once the quilt is quilted.

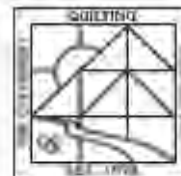

# 2019 Mystery Quilt

**Calling all Mystery Lovers!** It's time to start a new Mystery Quilt. This year's quilt, Faithful Friends, specifically designed for CQC and will finish at 54"× 62". So, grab some friends and join in for some fun. I'm using fall colored fabrics so it can be entered in our Quilt-A-Fair Quilt Show, but this pattern would be wonderful in any color combination.

Please read all instructions before beginning. Basic quilt making and rotary-cutting skills are assumed. All dimensions include 1/4" seam allowances, unless otherwise indicated. Accurate cutting and piecing are needed. It is recommended that the first unit in each step be sewn and measured. Adjust your seam allowance as needed to achieve the correct size.

## Fabric Selection

Selecting fabrics is part of the fun of a mystery quilt. I've included a picture of the fabrics I've selected, but choose whatever fabrics you like (page 13).. It's fun to see all the different fabrics quilters choose for mystery quilts.

Pick fabrics you love, that coordinate well and have good contrast.

Color A (Multi-color print): 1 3/4 yards; this is a focus fabric, so pick one that "speaks" to you and use it to choose the remaining coordinating fabrics.

Color B (Dark): 3/4 yard

Color C (Medium): 3/4 yard

Color D (Medium): 1/2 yard

Color E (Light/Bright): 1/2 yard

Color F (Medium): 1 yard; needs to contrast with Colors C and D

Background (Light): 3/4 yard; should have good contrast with Colors A, B, C, D & F

Binding: 1/2 yard; can be included in the above yardage for Color A, or additional yardage for Color C or D

Note: Yardages given are based on having a 40" useable width of fabric.

## Cutting Instructions

Color A: Cut 4 strips 6 1/2" by length of fabric which will be used for the final border.

From the remaining fabric, cut one (1) 4 1/2" square and 24 squares, each 2 7/8".

If using for binding, cut 5 strips 2 1/2" by length from the remaining fabric.

Color B: Cut 4 strips 2 7/8" by width of fabric (WOF); subcut into 52 squares, each 2 7/8".

Cut 1 strips 2 1/2" by WOF; subcut into 4 squares, each 2 1/2".

Cut 5 strips 1 1/2" by WOF.

Color C: Cut 2 strips 5 1/4" by WOF; subcut into 9 squares, each 5 1/4".

Cut 4 strips 2 1/2" by WOF.

Color D: Cut 1 strip 5 1/4" by WOF; subcut into 6 squares, each 5 1/4".

Cut 2 strips 2 7/8" by WOF; subcut into 24 squares, each 2 7/8".

Color E: Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" by WOF; subcut into 12 squares, each 2 1/2".

Cut 3 strips 2 7/8" by WOF; subcut into 28 squares, each 2 7/8".

Color F: Cut 5 strips 2 7/8" by WOF; subcut into 56 squares, each 2 7/8".

Cut 1 strip 5 1/4" by WOF; subcut into 5 squares, each 5 1/4"

Cut 4 strips 1 1/2" by WOF.

Background: Cut 4 strips 2 7/8" by WOF; subcut into 40 squares, each 2 7/8" and 4 squares 2 1/2".

Cut 1 strip 6 7/8" by WOF; subcut into 4 squares 6 7/8" and 1 square 5 1/4"

Binding: If not using Color A, cut 6 strips 2 1/2" by WOF.

# Texture/Translucency for Fiber Collage

Teacher Lynn Koolish led workshop participants through the contents of the packed canvas messenger bags each received, explaining the various fibers, fusibles, and even silk rods and cocoons inside. She shared how each can be painted and used in mixed-media pieces, and demonstrated how a heat gun can turn a sheet of Lutradur into a lacy, textured surface. Then folks got to work spending the morning painting the contents of the bags. Some even painted the canvas bags, and many enjoyed spray painting with stencils.

Following lunch, workshop participants began designing collages from the pieces they'd painted. Some added hand stitching and embroidery. Others added beads, trims and a variety of textured materials they'd brought to class, including fabrics and plastics. As they worked, Lynn shared information on design and color and encouraged participants to cut up their painted fibers.

Luana Rubin, co-owner of eQuilter in Boulder, welcomed the group to the classroom at the company's new headquarters and offered a tour of the facility during the lunch break.

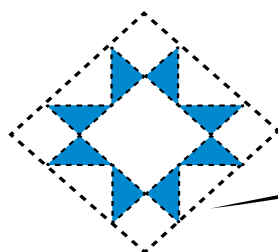

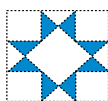

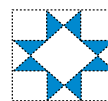
